This morning we are going to follow Paul's lead and investigate what it takes to be a Super Bowl Christian in a Super Bowl church and how those things relate to our own journey toward the greatest event we will ever be a part of when Jesus returns to take the faithful home to God. The men on the field today have planned to be there and have followed through on their plans. I hope you are making plans as well. May we realize God's continual help in our efforts to be "Super Bowl" quality Christians.


