

The Hope In Christ

The Christian's desire and expectation to receive the promises of God are grounded in the resurrection and glorification of Christ Jesus. In other words, his hope is in Christ, for hope is defined as "desire accompanied by ex-



pectation." Hope is not desire alone because there are things one may desire that he has no expectation of receiving. For example, a man on death row may desire to get out of prison, but have no expectation of being released. He doesn't really have "hope" of being set free. Likewise, expectation alone is not hope, for there are things one might expect that he may not desire. One doesn't desire paying taxes every year, but he expects to send them in every April. Desire minus expectation is frustration; expectation minus desire is dread, but when one has both desire and expectation, he has hope. Someone says, "I hope to go to heaven." He desires to go to heaven, but because of doubt will not say "I expect to go," but just says, "I hope to." This is not biblical hope, for biblical hope has no doubt.

Jesus died with a hope of receiving the promises of God (Heb. 12:2). God fulfilled His promise to resurrect Jesus and makes the same promise to us. Peter said, "This Jesus God raised up again, to which we all are witnesses. Therefore having been exalted to the right hand of God and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit, He has poured forth this which you both see and hear" (Acts 2:32–33). He also declared, "The promise is for you and your children, and for all who are far off, as many as the Lord our God shall call to Himself" (Acts

God calls men by the gospel to receive that promise (2 Thess. 2:12) and is willing to adopt men as sons that they might receive this inheritance along with Jesus (Rom. 8:15–18). God desires people to be united with Him in glory and has provided a means by which they can have their sin removed and live with the hope of one day receiving that glory. The resurrected Christ is that means. "This hope we have as an anchor of the soul, a hope both sure and steadfast and one which enters within the veil, where Jesus has entered as a forerunner for us ..." (Heb. 6:19–20). The child of God who strives to live in faithful obedience can not only desire to receive these wonderful promises, but can also expect to receive them because of what God has provided in Christ.
