Game of Thrones and the Burning of Notre Dame



Two events had the entire world talking this past week. One was the opening of the final season of the television series "Game of Thrones," and the other was the burning of the Notre Dame Cathedral. I am far from a practicing Roman Catholic, but it was still sad to watch the destruction of an historic building that has been a part of so many lives in multiple ways. Most everyone understands (on some level at least) the connection between it and the art world, but that barely scratches the surface of its importance and connections to music, history, politics, culture, ...even literature and entertainment (you may remember it once housed a famous man known for his hunched back!).

I continue to hear about the "ancient religious relics" that were saved. When you see those reports, many times the speaker is likely referring to the crown of thrones that reportedly belonged to Jesus and a piece of wood said to be from His cross. Those are interesting ideas to consider, but don't let your imagination run too far. It is highly doubtful anyone considered those items important enough to pick up and preserve in that moment. Jesus was viewed as an enemy by the Jewish religious elite, and his supporters (either in ignorance or unbelief) believed the crucifixion was an end to their hopes and dreams instead of the start of something big.

As people across the world mourn the loss of Notre Dame, let us be reminded that the church is not a building. We are the church. We are the ones who should be filled with music of praise to our God. We are God's masterpiece (His artwork), chosen to be holy and blameless in his sight... prepared for every good work. We are the ones who should be speaking God's voice into politics, culture, and even the entertainment world. Did you watch Game of Thrones? Would Jesus have joined you had he been over to your house that evening?

Instead of mourning the loss of a building, let us be the church in this world. Instead of celebrating the opening of a TV series based on sex and extreme violence, let us remember on this day (and all other days) who is the true king, and let us serve Him in all that we do.
