Another day it was very cold (when I said I would change it, the weather was warm and sunny!). Today it is raining, and I needed to write this article. For two weeks now, I've let something keep me from changing that sign.

Now, the church sign is one thing. I don't suppose any real harm or wrong has been done in having the same message for so long (except that we all have it memorized by now!). The thing that must concern me and all of us is that we don't let such as this happen to our faith.

A lot of time can pass (far too much time) before we do something about our bad standing before God or our fractured relationships with others. Today we're too busy. Yesterday we just didn't feel good. Tomorrow, it will be something else. Before you know it, we get used to unfaithfulness or bitterness, and it becomes a way of life. Then we're really in trouble. We don't even think about it anymore. We manipulate the conscience to where it doesn't bother us. We think other people are meddling if they talk with us about it.

It would be a lot easier if we would just go ahead and do what we know we need to do. In spite of the darkness and the rain, I'm going right now to change that sign!
