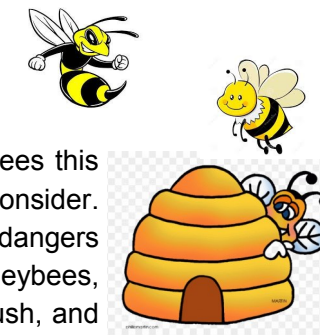

## Threats to the Hive



As we take a small break from our series on honeybees this week, I still wanted to leave you with some things to consider. An article I read recently identified one of the greatest dangers to the bee is the yellowjacket. They actually target honeybees, hang around the entrance to the hive waiting to ambush, and pick off individual bees as they come and go.

The good news for the bee is that the hive is armed with a formidable defense against such attacks. When a yellowjacket is bold enough to attack a hive, guard bees will sting the intruder. They will also gather around individual yellowjackets and "cook" them to death with body heat, which has been recorded at more than 120 degrees! A dozen or so honeybees usually can accomplish this on a single yellowjacket. If the beehive weakens though, yellowjackets go from being a nuisance to a genuine threat and can even cause the beehive to collapse and fail.

As with all of our discussions, I pray you have been already thinking about this on a spiritual level as we have been relating the hive to the church (if you weren't thinking spiritually, I'll wait for you to go back and read the opening paragraphs a second time). Today, my desire is just to remind and encourage us to stay strong as a hive. We are undergoing a transitional time with two of our ministries here at Jackson St., but those changes have ripple effects throughout the entire hive that could be deadly. Now is a great time to go back and read about the fruit of the Spirit from Galatians 5:22-23 and work toward being extra diligent in demonstrating love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control... "against such things there is no law!"

Above all, this time of transition requires your prayers for God's wisdom and guidance to all involved, humility and submission to God and to one another, and a demonstration of grace and forgiveness when something does not quite go as planned. Remember, the ultimate goal is to honor God in everything we do. May He bless our every effort to do so within this hive at Jackson St. and may He keep us alert for the yellowjackets who seek our harm.
