

The Dignity of Work

The Garden of Eden was a paradise on earth, yet there was work to be done. "And the Lord God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to dress it and to keep it" (Gen. 2:15).

Our idea of paradise would probably not include work—but God's did, and we need to see the many and varied benefits that come from our labors in life.

- 1. A sense of accomplishment—Solomon said, "The sleep of a laboring man is sweet, whether he eat little or much" (Ecc. 5:12). God knew man needed to labor and achieve in order to preserve his self-worth.
- 2. The building of character—While the farmer cultivates the crop, the crop cultivates the farmer. As a man builds a house, the house builds the man. One's employment calls forth ingenuity, dedication, and steadfastness. These things build one's character.
- 3. **Keeping one free from evil**—Idleness is itself a curse and leads to other evils. This was true of the Thessalonians, for Paul wrote: "For we hear that there are some which walk among you disorderly, working not at all, but are busybodies" (2 Thess. 3:11).

The Christian should be an exemplary worker and ought to be:

- 1. Enthusiastic—"Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might" (Ecc. 9:10). We should try to maintain enthusiasm for our work. If it is lacking, we may need to change jobs. Often, however, we merely need to change our attitude toward our job.
- 2. Diligent—Scripture says: "He becometh poor that dealeth with a slack hand: but the hand of the diligent maketh rich" (Prov. 10:4). Many people in our day want to do as little as possible on the job. We must be careful that we not be infected with this careless spirit.
- 3. Honest—The Christian must "provide for things honest in the sight of all men" (Rom. 12:17). "Let him that stole steal no more: but rather let him labor, working with his hands the thing which is good" (Eph. 4:28).


