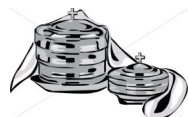

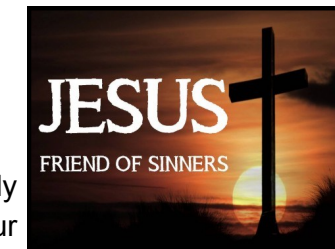

A Friend of Sinners



A number of us were early to worship when suddenly a loud, abrasive sound shattered the serenity of our pre-Bible class routine. We all turned to see what some would call a "Hell's Angel" type riding a big, ugly motorcycle, and he was pulling into *our* parking lot. I will never forget my first thought when I realized this person was staying for worship: "What is *he* doing here?" I was not the only one with such a thought; few people went out of their way to greet him.

To my surprise, the next Sunday brought another visit from this man. It was then I discovered that not everyone had avoided him. One member saw a precious soul and was not prejudiced by appearance. He invited Pete to study the Bible, and within a few weeks Pete was baptized. A few weeks later, Pete was teaching others. Three years later he was preaching full time, and Pete is now one of the finest young preachers I have ever heard.

In Luke 17:34, the Pharisees made a truthful accusation against Jesus saying He was a "*friend of publicans and sinners.*" James strongly warns against offering a lower standard of treatment to the man who comes into the assembly "*in vile raiment*" (Jms. 2:1-13).

What was that thought I had? "What is *he* doing here?" What did I think he was doing here? Does it matter? Christ calls on us to follow His example and be a friend of sinners, and we will never do it by avoiding those who are *perceived* as different. How many church members sin by not seeking to teach those who are on a lower social or economic level?

When you go to worship, look around for those you don't know. Look for the person who may not be dressed nicely—or who is possibly dressed too nice. Look for the man who has hair that is too long or the woman who has a dress that's too short. Look for the person who appears bewildered or unsure of where to go. I thank God there was a friend of sinners who did that for Pete.
